About Edmund Sprunger:

A former student of Suzuki Method originator Dr. Shin'ichi Suzuki, Edmund Sprunger has taught violin for more than 25 years, and presented more than 300 workshops and master classes throughout North and South America. A registered teacher trainer with the Suzuki Association of the Americas, Sprunger has presented sessions at numerous state, national, and international conferences. He holds a BA in music from Goshen College, where he studied violin with Lon Sherer, and piano and piano pedagogy with Marvin Blickenstaff. Also trained as a psychotherapist, he holds a Masters in Social Work from the University of Michigan and has done post-degree training with the Michigan and St. Louis psychoanalytic institutes. He has served on the Board of Directors of the Suzuki Association of the Americas and as Chair of the American String Teachers Association's [ASTA] Committee on Studio Instruction. In 2004 he received an ASTA Citation for Leadership and Merit, and directs the Child Development Program at the St. Louis Psychoanalytic Institute.
