Piano students will receive a 30-minute private lesson, a movement class, parent classes and an enrichment class. A box lunch is available on Saturday.

In addition, child education expert Ed Sprunger will offer a workshop for teachers on Friday, March 16.

Workshop faculty

Ed Sprunger – Sprunger has served on the Board of Directors of the Suzuki Association of the Americas and as Chair of the American String Teachers Association's [ASTA] Committee on Studio Instruction. In 2004 he received an ASTA Citation for Leadership and Meit. He serves as director of the Child Development Program at the St. Louis Psychoanalytic Institute. Hiroko Driver Lippman – A native of Takatsuki, Japan, Lippman is a protégé of Suzuki founder Shinichi Suzuki. The former director of the University of Louisville Suzuki program now is director of her own studio in Anchorage, Ky.



Avi Friedlander – Associate principal cellist of the Atlanta Opera and adjunct cello professor at Birmingham Southern College, Friedman is a former New World Symphony member and teaches at the Santa Fe Suzuki Institute.



Jill Wright – Director of Cello at Capital University and Suzuki Music Columbus, Wright has performed in Europe, Japan and the U.S. Wright has been a chamber music coach and guest teacher at institutes across the country.



Wayne Krigger – A cellist and graduate of University of Louisville, Krigger has taught at workshops throughout the Midwest and South and emphasizes the connections of body, mind, voice and spirit with Suzuki principles.



Rita Hauck – Director of her own studio in Cincinnati, Hauck has been a Suzuki piano teacher in the United States since 1974. She is the founder and former director of a Suzuki school of 350 students at Oklahoma Wesleyan University, where she was on the piano and organ faculty.



Mary Craig Powell – Powell is the author of the book *Focus on Suzuki Piano*, a compilation of ideas and techniques she has employed as a Suzuki instructor in Columbus, Ohio. She is an active member and official of the Suzuki Association of the Americas.



BettyAnne Gottlieb – A faculty member at CCM, violist Gottlieb's has taught for a wide array of age groups and focuses, including elementary, strings, band and general music. She has conducted youth orchestras at the Cleveland Institute of Music, and has taught private and group Suzuki lessons.
