WHAT YOU SHOULD KNOW

- Each camp has a minimum and maximum enrollment. Some camps reach the maximum quickly. Please follow the directions for each specific camp to insure a space in or audition for your desired program. Please note specific camp deadlines.
- Camps at our UC Blue Ash College location are noted with a ⚙️.
- Please go online to 🌐www.ccm.uc.edu/prep for complete and up-to-date information, including registration forms for specific camps. All forms are available in our office and on our website.
- Programs that require audition are noted with a ★. Please follow registration information as specified for those programs.

- **There is no refund for summer workshops except for medical emergencies.** A doctor's written note must be provided.
- Each camper will receive detailed information via email and additional forms regarding each camp prior to the starting date. It is critical that you include an active email on your registration form. All individuals under age 18 must have a completed medical form on file.

APPRENTICE OPPORTUNITIES FOR HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS

Apprentices, or "camp counselors," are a vital part of the CCM Prep program. Positions are available for high school students ages 14–18 who are accomplished as performing artists and who have a desire to work with children. These apprentices serve as role models for our young artists and support them in day-to-day camp and performing activities. Students wishing to apply for apprentice positions should complete the online application and have a letter of recommendation from a knowledgeable adult. Deadline is May 5. Each student accepted into the apprentice program will receive a stipend that can be used for study at CCM Prep during the summer or during the 2012–2013 academic year. 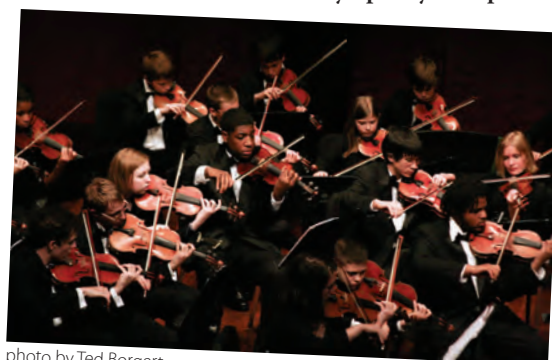

HOUSING OPPORTUNITIES

Housing is available in the University of Cincinnati dorms for students age 14 and older who are attending the High School Musical Theatre Workshop, Encore Orchestra, or Crescendo12 Chamber Music Workshop during the weeks of June 18–29. Students are fully chaperoned at all times when they are not in classes. The cost for this option is \$700 per week (this amount does not include tuition). ⚙️ CCM Summer Strings at UC Blue Ash

June 11–15

This camp is geared towards students in public school string programs. In addition to daily rehearsal, students will receive coaching, sectionals and musical enrichment activities. The students will be divided into two groups:

Students in grades 4–6 or with one or two years of experience will attend from 9am–noon and perform a final concert on June 15 at noon. **Cost:** \$100
Students in grades 6–8 or with three or more years of experience will attend from 9am–2pm with a final concert at 2pm on Friday. **Cost:** \$150

Summer Saxophone Symposium

Ages: For high school students

This intensive five-day workshop is aimed at motivated students looking for an in-depth study of saxophone performance and literature. Individualized instruction, supervised practice and coaching in chamber music and jazz performance are part of the daily schedule. Participants will also have performance opportunities in master classes, as well as the Finale Concert.

Ages: For string students in grades 7–12

The Encore Advanced Chamber Orchestra features great literature for string orchestra and soloists. Each day, students will participate in orchestra rehearsals, sectionals, master classes and enrichment activities led by selected faculty from the University of Cincinnati College-Conservatory of Music, the Cincinnati Symphony Orchestra and guest artists. Encore Advanced Chamber Orchestra students can also participate in the **Encore-Clermont Symphony Competition**. *Note: Younger students recommended by their teachers are welcome to audition for this program. Music will be sent to each participant several weeks before the camp begins.*

Live auditions will take place on March 10 and 11. Please contact the Prep Office at ☎513-556-2595 to schedule an audition time. Recorded auditions will also be accepted if submitted by link to an audio or video performance posted online.

Ages: For students of strings, piano, flute, oboe, clarinet, bassoon, and French horn in grades 7–12

Crescendo12 is a chamber music festival in which participants perform alongside artist faculty. Ensemble activities are supported by daily private instrumental instruction, classes and master classes with select members of the University of Cincinnati's College-Conservatory of Music, with members of the Cincinnati Symphony Orchestra and with our guest artists. We welcome preformed ensembles. Crescendo12 is opened by a faculty concert, and showcases its participants with concerts at the end of the week. Housing is available for this camp.

At an all-Steinway school, CCM Prep is proud to announce that our faculty and guests will offer the eighth annual Cincinnati Piano Institute.

The standard course is designed for piano students from age 6 and up. The daily classes will include piano instruction, theory/musicianship classes, practice hour, music concerts, and arts/crafts enrichment classes. There will also be a daily hour to explore other fine arts areas such as recorder and ballet. No audition necessary for this camp.

The Advanced Institute is for selected students who will receive an intense piano instruction in a fun environment. Participants will practice together and learn from stimulating artist-teachers for a week. In addition to master classes, participants will attend chamber music coaching, musicianship class, and performance practice class.

Audition requirements: a CD or video of two contrasting pieces performed by an applicant sent by May 19 to ccm@ccm.uc.edu CCM Preparatory/Cincinnati Piano Institute, University of Cincinnati, PO Box 210236, Cincinnati, OH 45221-0236. Audition repertoire must be in the level of Beethoven Sonata, Op. 49 or higher. Returning Advanced Institute students do not have to audition. CPI will notify the course acceptance by June 1. Students are encouraged to send their audition recordings early.

Ages: For students ages 5–10

This fun and exciting ballet camp will introduce students to four traditional story ballets — *Sleeping Beauty*, *Swan Lake*, *The Nutcracker* and *Coppelia* — and teach them simplified choreography of the major characters. Each day dancers will make crafts that will be used in the performance. Videos of the ballets will be incorporated in the camp. Students will participate in a daily ballet class where they will learn basic ballet vocabulary and technique. An informal student performance takes place in the ballet studio on the final day. Students should wear ballet attire, which includes a leotard, tights and ballet shoes. Prior ballet instruction is not necessary.
